

Elizabeth Levy is Counsel for Siemens Healthcare Diagnostics, a worldwide manufacturer of medical diagnostics devices, formerly Bayer Healthcare Diagnostics. She provides general legal support for several business

units with an emphasis on commercial, antitrust, contract, regulatory and compliance matters. She joined Bayer in 2001 as senior patent counsel and in 2005 became lead counsel for its Near-Patient Testing segment, now the Point-of-Care business unit. She holds two United States patents for inventions in the field of incandescent lamps.
